



Dr. Shirley Ngai is an Associate Professor of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Her teaching specialty is Cardiopulmonary Physiotherapy. Shirley is the principal applicant and co-applicant for more than USD\$1.12 million of teaching and learning grants to develop teaching innovation to address students' learning needs and to enhance their learning experience. She is the recipient of several teaching awards including 2013/14 RS departmental outstanding teaching award, 2013/14 Faculty award for outstanding performance in teaching, 2016 UGC Teaching Award (Early Career Faculty Member) by University Grants Council, Second Prize of 2018 National Teaching Achievement Award (Higher Education) by Ministry of Education in China and 2019/20 President's Awards for Outstanding Achievement in Teaching by The Hong Kong Polytechnic University.

Dr. Yuk-lun Cheng is the Chief of Nephrology at the Alice Ho Miu Ling Nethersole Hospital.
